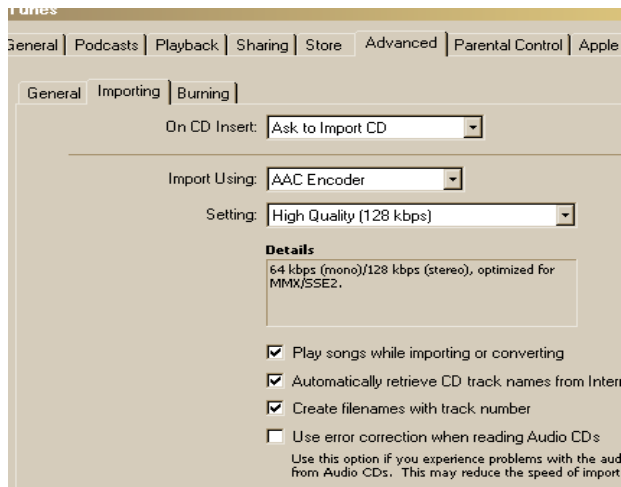
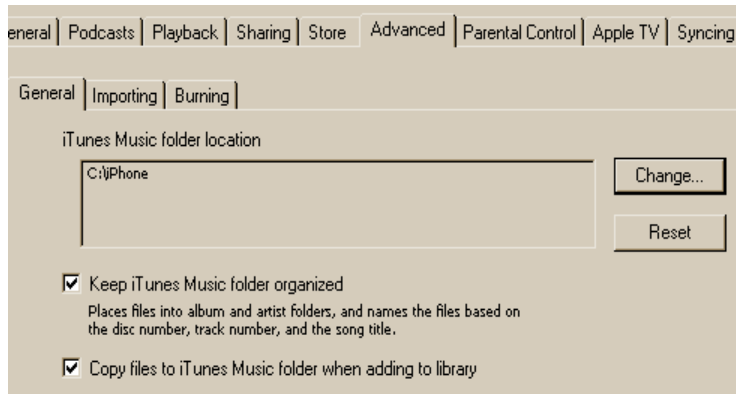


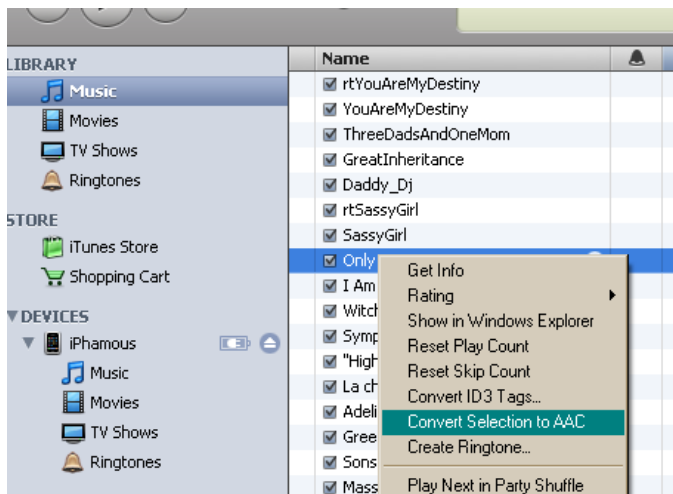
1) Set Import Using AAC Encoder



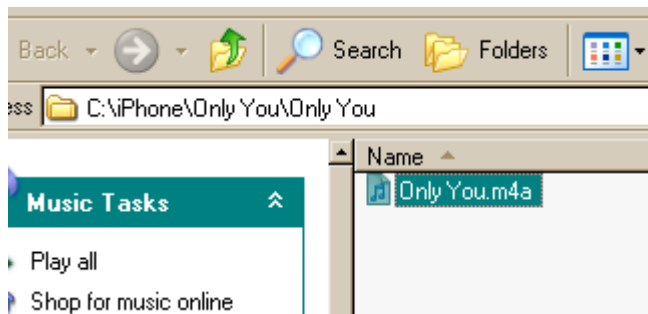
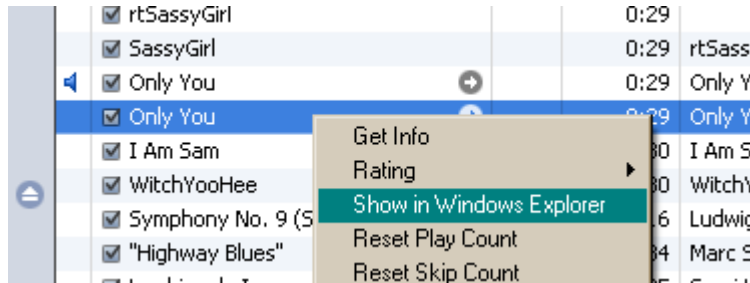
2) Change iTunes Music folder location to new location (optional). You can find converted files *.m4a much more easier later on. I change it to C:\iPhone



3) Click on Music under LIBRARY, and select a mp3 song you want to make a ringtone. The song should 500KB or less, and length should not longer than 30 sec. Right click on the song, and then select Convert Selection to AAC



- 4) iTunes will create new file *.m4a. Right click on the new file and select Show in Windows Explorer to locate the new file



- 5) Rename it to *.m4r , then drag and drop it into Ringtones under LIBRARY in iTunes to show it in Ringtones library. You can drag and drop it to your iphone to sync the ringtone too.
- 6) It is best to enable these 2 options to allow drag and drop files between library and iphone.
