In this case, it seems as if I do. If I turn off wi-fi I cannot view the webarchive on my mac or ipad, the page pops up and it says "this journal is unavailable" vs. all the photos it normally shows.  
I tried the print>pdf>save as PDF and it did not work, it saved the page as 17 distorted pages of what appears to be the individual pages (although there are more than 17 pics on the collage) they are all stretched and distorted it is hard to even tell which "photo" is which.

It may not be the most elegant solution, but you could take screen captures of the page... take one, scroll down a page, take another, etc. Then you could join those shots in one long .png file. Also, if saving as a .pdf didn't work, you might try installing [CUPS-PDF](#) and then File > Print from Safari to the CUPS-PDF "printer".

There may be apps that can do this easily. While not elegant, here's one method that will work. Let's say you have 10 screen captures that are 1000 pixels wide and 700 pixels high.

1. Start by taking another screen cap of some blank white space... any size.
2. Open that screen cap in Preview and use Tools > Adjust Size to change the size of that image to 1000 pixels wide by 7000 pixels high.
3. Now save that image as your "canvas", giving it a filename, but leave the image open.
4. Open the first of your 10 screen captures in Preview, then Command-C to copy it.
5. Click on your "canvas" and Command-V to paste.
6. Position that image at the top of the "canvas" and Command-S to save changes.
7. Open the next of your 10 screen captures in Preview and Command-S to copy it.
8. Click on your "canvas" and Command-V to paste.
9. Position that image immediately below the previous image and Command-S to save changes.
10. Repeat steps 7-9 for each of the screen captures.

After you install it, restart your computer. Then, when you want to print to a .pdf, simply select File > Print from any app, then click the dropdown menu showing your list of printers and select CUPS-PDF as your printer.

In case you haven't solved this puzzle yet, I was reading another thread just now about how to easily arrange a bunch of image files in Preview and save to PDF.  
  
If you take a series of screen shots as GGJ Studios suggested, here's the info to combine them pretty quickly into one PDF rather than copying & pasting each one separately into a large Preview file (from altoidboy btw):  
  
Quote:  
Easy way to do it in Preview:

1. Open all JPG's (or PNG's, or other graphics files) in Preview.
2. Make sure sidebar (showing thumbnails of each page) is visible.
3. Make sure order of JPG's is correct (if not, drag them into the order you want).
4. Select all thumbnails (shift-click is an easy way).
5. File > Print Selected Images (caution: NOT just "Print" but "Print Selected Images")
6. Lower left corner > Save as PDF.

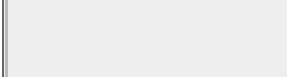
